Iris's notes:

Zelemnia* (*Zlm.*) *Midas* (*Tolu. Red Belt x Zel.onusta*)

The genus *Oncidium* was too inclusive and confused. There were several groups that did not belong there. There were other genera with the same problem.

Oncidium onustum was changed to *Zelenkoa onusta*.

The equitant *Oncidium*s definitely did not belong there. Years ago, Rafinesque proposed the genus *Tolumnia*. However, there was a problem because *Onc. variegatum* (now *Tolumnia variegata*) was the type species for the genus *Oncidium*. I think they got around it by bringing in a species that was older than variegate and belonged in *Oncidium*. Finally, all those cute little Caribbean species are now *Tolumnia*. *Tolumnia Red Belt* is an old hybrid from that group. Consequently, *Tolumnia Red Belt x Zelenkoa onusta* = *Zelemnia Midas*.

Onc.* *Hawaiian Sunset* (*Pupukea Sunset x fuscatum*)

There used to be a *Miltonia warscewiczii*, which was widely used in hybridizing. However, further research determined that it was not a *Miltonia* and belonged in *Oncidium*. The name was changed to *Onc. fuscatum*. Therefore, a lot of popular crosses that used to be called *Miltonidium* are now *Oncidium*. *Onc. Hawaiian Sunset* is a backcross of *Pupukea Sunset* back to *fuscatum*.

allow you to report at 9:30 a.m. on Friday, April 28 to participate as judging clerks. The head judge will begin to organize judging teams at this time in preparation for the official start of judging at 10:30 a.m.

Immediately following judging, the assistance of volunteers with computer skills in recording ribbons and awards and producing reports of awards for exhibitors is needed.

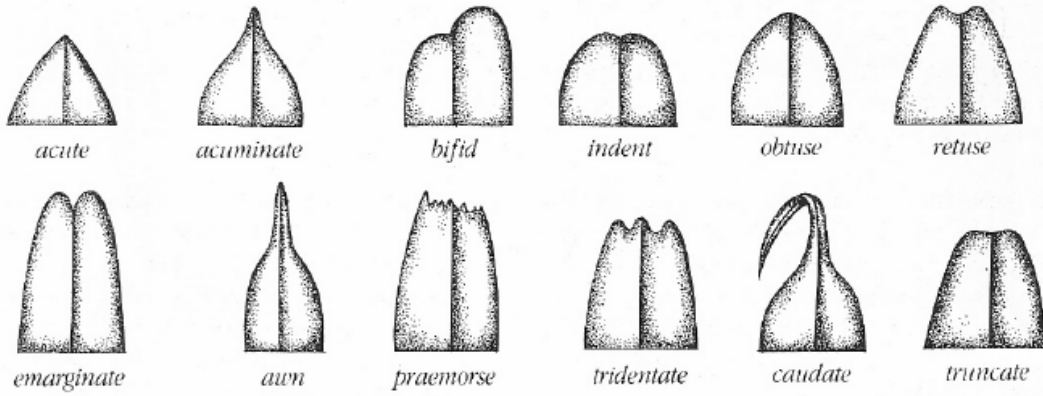

Some Little Mentioned Facts about Parts of Plants

With *orchidaceae*, we typically admire the shape, color and diversity of flowers but usually, we are at a loss when we attempt to describe plants that are not flowering. In the scientific classification of plants, the petals and leaves can also be used for a more precise description of plant material. The diagram shown below presents some of the descriptions used for this purpose and they can serve as aids to distinguish different types of material. This information can help you to describe one of your plants to someone else or narrow down the identification of an unknown plant in your collection.

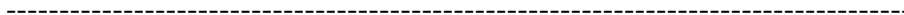
