**Minutes for March 20**

Ben Cabot, President, called the meeting to order at 2:05 PM.

Minutes of the February meeting were approved by the members.

The guest speaker Mr. Kim Feddersen was introduced. He, along with his wife Carolyn, are from Fair Orchids of Maplewood New Jersey. His topic was how to grow Vandas in the northeast. He presented his lecture with a video of these orchids.

- Vandaceous - 1425 species 10,123 hybrids
- Phalinopsic - 78 species 31,031 hybrids
- They grow in the Himalayas , SE Asia and the Philippines.
- Some grow high up and some are cool growers
- Light has a direct impact on the flowers color and quality
- They can be grown in empty baskets - must water daily
- Inside they will grow in an empty vase (clear) fill with water for 15-30 minutes then release the water. Biweekly water with fertilizer.
- Night temp. - 65 degrees F.
- They grow from small, medium to large. Philippines have the largest flowers

Mr. Feddersen also brought in many orchids for sale.

Refreshments were then enjoyed. Thank you to those who brought in the goodies. Raffle tickets were sold after which the raffle was held. A big Thank You to John Zygmunt for the wonderful items.

Show Table: There were numerous orchids on display. Reminder to sign the book when you bring in an orchid. Paula Matienzo gave a brief talk on knowing the plants correct names and species. It is important if the orchid is to be shown in the future at a show. Vendors for the orchid show is the issue. We will have 2 vendors for next year. Changes in taxonomy, as well as difficulties with spelling, necessitate that authorities in the study of orchids be consulted. Hence names of hybrids – those which are not of Greek or Latin derivation – have been checked against the RHS Orchid Hybrid Registry. It is not the hybrid name that changes, but the genus. On the other hand, names of species – those which are completely of Greek or Latin origin – have been searched in the Kew World Checklist of Monocotyledons. Parts of plant names appearing in boldface represent corrections in spelling or additional information found in these databases that may be of interest to the grower.
